

### Applying to Universities & University Destinations

Students are encouraged to begin the application process by mid-November of their graduating year. It is recommended that students apply to 5 institutions so as to keep their options open. Universities will accept a student on the strength of their best set of marks in December, either the HGS percentage grade or the IB anticipated marks (as final marks are not available until July 6). Typically students will be informed of their acceptance between February and May.

*Of the graduates of 2009 who applied to university this year, 100% earned entrance to the Canadian university of their choice, and most the faculties of their choice.* McGill remained the most competitive school this year, followed by Queen's University, the University of Western Ontario, University of Toronto, and the University of British Columbia. The most challenging faculties for admission were The Richard Ivey School of Business at Western and the Faculty of Commerce at Queen's. Each of these schools requires top marks, as well as a short essay, demonstration of commitment to a variety of extra-curricular activities and leadership positions, as well as references.

The most popular destinations this year were Dalhousie University, followed by Queen's, McGill and Acadia.

### Scholarships

There are two types of scholarships. The first, the entrance scholarship, is strictly based upon students December marks and do not require an application. The second type of scholarship does include an application, as well as academic and character references, essays and a resume of community service and extra- and co-curricular activities. These scholarships, including major university named scholarships, as well as various national awards, are the more prestigious and most valuable scholarships. Opportunities for applying for scholarships begin as early as October and continue into late March. Over 76% of the graduating class of 2009 earned one or more scholarships, up from 50% in 2008, including:

An unprecedented \$933 000 of scholarship money has been offered to HGS graduates. \$473 000 of this offered money has been accepted. Some universities have very generous scholarship programs while others do not. Many of our students will attend a university that has not offered them money. Once final marks have been released and the IB results are made available, further scholarship money will awarded. Schools like the University of Western Ontario only give out merit scholarships once the final results have been received, and other schools will increase the scholarship monies if marks improve.
